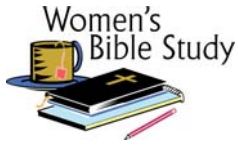
Lutheran Social Services Adoption

Gently used or new **items we use** to make various mission kits and projects are as follows:

- Baby clothing up to size 2T
 - Sleepers Cloth diapers Baby Hats
 - Sweaters / sweatshirts under shirts or oneies
 - Receiving blankets
- Bath towels
- Hand towels
- Wash cloths
- Fabrics- cotton or cotton blend
- Flannel
- Buttons (cards of 6 or more 1/2" to 5/8 ")
- Bed sheets- flannel, or cotton, any size used to make receiving blankets and quilt backs

These items are used in the assembly of Layettees, Midwife kits, School, Sewing & Health kits for Lutheran World Relief, Midwife and Hospice Kits for Global Health Ministries, and quilts which are given to many places including nursing and care facilities, Ronald Mc Donald and Gilda's house for cancer patients, Veterans Hospital, homeless shelters, WI Native American Tribes, Mexico, LWR.

If you have a garage sale and have any of these items leftover your donations would be appreciated, or don't have a garage sale and donate your items to us and the

other places we work with to help the less fortunate; spread the word.
